## MAJOR GRANT PROGRAM

The Moran-Ventre Charitable Foundation embarked upon a Major Grant program to distribute \$200,000 to causes that will continue to have a meaningful impact on the community of Special Needs Individuals.

In 2020, The Ben Moran Scholarship Fund was created at the Rhode Island College Foundation. Special Education students who will be pursuing a professional career serving Individuals with Special Needs are eligible to apply. The \$150,000 RIC Ben Moran Scholarship Fund was approved by the MV Foundation Board of Directors over a 3 year giving period. Income from this investment will be used to fund annual scholarships to deserving Rhode Island College Special Education students for many years to come.

In 2023, The Moran Ventre Charitable Foundation provided a Grant of \$50,000 to 48 South Angell Condo Trust, a private group home that was established over 30 years ago by loving parents who wanted to give their adult special needs children the opportunity to live as independently as possible. The 10-person residence is professionally managed. This Grant was provided to assist with capital funding for much needed renovations to better serve the needs of the residents.
